Commonwealth Electric Company Des Moines recently attended the groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of the new Student Center on the Grand View University Campus. The 65,700 square foot, design-build, two story addition consists of student assembly space, general offices and classrooms, as well as a bookstore and student dining and food services.

Commonwealth's scope of work includes a new electrical service, new power distribution equipment and feeders, site and interior lighting, automated lighting controls, fire alarm, sound systems, electrical for a new food service and kitchen area and telephone data cabling.

Venter Spooner is the General Contractor with FEH as the architectural firm. The Commonwealth team includes Mike Duffy and Mark Ramsey as Project Managers, Dianna Merritt as Project Estimator, Ashley Benda as Project Coordinator and Jeff Hoover as the Project Foreman. Additionally, Clint Bailey, RCCD will be managing our telephone and communication installations on the project.

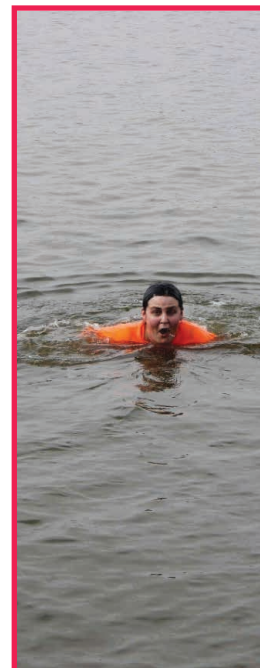
It didn't take long for this fundraiser to gain some steam and start getting participants all over the world.

He will be starting radiation treatments soon and you can see his smiling face in pictures and videos his parents post on the "Plunge for Landon" Facebook page. He's a brave little boy and hopefully each plunge will give his family a little less to worry about.

Commonwealth Electric Selected For Medical Office Building Addition Columbus Community Hospital

The Columbus Community Hospital has an existing Healthpark Medical Office Building located adjacent to the hospital. This building houses a variety of offices making available services in all types of healthcare by physicians primarily located in Columbus; and those visiting specialists that maintain hours and practices that keep community members “close to home” for their necessary treatments and visits.



The expansion of several “visiting physicians” and specialty practices has required more room for this Healthpark. Thus TSP Architects were enlisted to design a 33,000 sq. ft. addition to the existing facility. We worked closely with Architect, Karl Person, in the Omaha office of TSP to provide budgeting, value engineering, and other information throughout the design and bidding process. We were pleased to earn this project, and have the opportunity to work with Journey Construction (Sioux Falls Construction) who has completed numerous healthcare and MOB projects in partnership with TSP.

Commonwealth was involved from day one with the underground services, and some required changes to the existing service to allow for this expansion. Our tight coordination with TSP and Journey insured that the existing facility was not disturbed in any manner and services were not interrupted as we prepared for the expansion of the MOB. The new addition will have five clinics within the building, two for visiting physicians, two clinics for services for women, and one general surgery clinic.

We are most pleased to have earned our first major project with Columbus Community Hospital and hope to expand our partnership with TSP and Journey Construction on other projects throughout the area.
