Baldwin Filter's Manufacturing Plant's New 4000 Amp Service, Kearney, NE



We are in the process of adding another service at Baldwin Filters in Kearney, Nebraska. Baldwin Filters is expanding its current operations at its Kearney, NE headquarters. CECM was hired to design & install a new 4000 amp 480 volt service.

During the design stage of the project, Brad Owen did the CAD work to create the drawings. We then submitted our drawings

to our Omaha office's group of engineers for approval. Josh Muench made some necessary changes, dressed up the drawings & stamped them for owner approval.

The scope of the project is to install a 2-4" duct bank from an existing manhole to the new transformer location. Install new 15 KV cable from existing S&C gear to the new transformer, install a loop feed to an existing transformer, and install a new 3000 KVA Transformer. Baldwin's current facility has all loop fed transformers. We kept that design throughout this project as well. We also installed a new 4000 amp 480 volt service with capacitor bank and will install a new 1200 amp feed for new equipment in 2016.





We have completed the expansion of an existing duct bank, installation of the 15 KV cable, installed the new 3000 KVA Transformer and the new 4000 amp service. We are currently working on the capacitor bank installation.

Project completion is spring of 2016.

Des Moines Branch Achieves Office-Wide CPR & AED Certification

Did you know that sudden cardiac arrest is one of the leading causes of death in this country? Would you know what to do if someone needed help? In an attempt to raise awareness for the importance of CPR and AED safety, the Des Moines branch recently completed office-wide CPR and AED training. With the help of Diana Duffy, American Red Cross training courses were offered to all Des Moines office employees and interns this past spring and by July, all employees were fully CPR and AED certified. The push for this certification came in large part due to the addition of a new AED in the office.

It was important to the Des Moines branch that proper training was offered and attained in case an incident ever arose where CPR and/or the AED needed to be utilized. The Des Moines office takes pride in knowing our employees are prepared with the necessary tools and training should a lifesaving instance ever occur. Safety is and will always be one of Commonwealth's main goals and something we continuously strive to maintain.

McAninch Corporation Overhauls Their Facility

The Des Moines office has been diligently working with McAninch Corporation over the course of the past year. Everything from the office addition, accompanied by an office renovation, shop addition and the current replacement of all the shop lights has been set into motion. The McAninch Corporation, founded and located in Des Moines, Iowa, is one of the largest dirt work contractors in the state. Due to recent growth over the past few years, their 76,500-plus square foot maintenance/operations facility was in need of expansion and renovation. Commonwealth Electric furnished and installed fix-

tures for the second floor expansion, as well as LED retrofits to the existing office spaces. McAninch followed the office addition and renovation with an almost 9,000 square foot cold storage addition. Commonwealth furnished and installed (25) 6-lamp, T5HO fluorescent fixtures, as well as the fire alarm system. The most current project is a (156) 1-for-1 fixture replacement of all existing shop lighting. Commonwealth is working to replace (121) 1000W fixtures with 8-lamp, T5HO fluorescent fixtures. The exterior night lights are included in this project as well. Commonwealth is replacing the (18) 400W wall packs with a more efficient

ng the (18) 400W wall packs with a more efficient LED fixture. Additionally, those same LED wall packs are being utilized to replace (10) wall packs in the wash bay. Key personnel for these projects include Nate Findlay (Project Manager), Kevin Harris (Electrical Foreman) and Lochlan McIntosh (Electrical Foreman).

McAninch will benefit from this work with significant energy savings. The new T5HO fixtures have over 55% less input watts than the 1000W fixtures and the LED wall packs have about 25% less input watts than the 400W wall packs. With the energy savings alone, this shop lighting renovation will pay off in just under 3 years. Commonwealth is happy to be a part of the McAninch Corporation's growing success and eager to continue working with them on future projects.

Fong's is Finally in Ankeny, Iowa

Commonwealth has finished the final touches of Fong's Pizza's new location in Ankeny, IA. Fong's Pizza is an Asian inspired pizza restaurant, which has become a Des Moines, IA favorite. Commonwealth provided electrical services for the new 6,000 square foot restaurant. The project consisted of a 400 amp service entrance, numerous forms of custom lighting, fire alarm, telephone data, sound system, wireless access points, video, and security. Key personnel for this job include Clint Bailey (Project Manager), Brad Ramsey (Electrical Foreman), Brent Kruse (Technician Foreman), and John Coffey (Systems Technician).

The new Ankeny location has a top-of-the-line kitchen, dining area, separate take-out counter, and a full-service bar. The kitchen is about three times larger than the kitchen at the original location in Des Moines. The dining area includes custom picked pendant lights in the shape of paper lanterns and antiqued rectangular lanterns to give it a more authentic Asian feel. LED tape lights were utilized to accent the bar shelves

and pendant lights were used for the seating area. Multiple televisions hang around the bar and dining area so guests can enjoy their favorite teams. The separated takeout counter and entrance incorporate the pendant lights from the dining area, as well as a television screen to display the daily lunch specials.
